These words of my father have inspired the establishment of a charter school, a community credit union, an early childhood development center, a banquet and conference facility, a welfare-to-work EARN Center, a crisis pregnancy assistance center, a mentoring program for kids with incarcerated parents, and a higher education institute for low-income people who could not otherwise afford to go to college before now. Look at what was accomplished in twenty years because of *your* commitment, financial resources, volunteerism and prayers.

The staff at PFP, who work here day in and day out, and I are enormously grateful to each and every one of you, our partners in this extraordinary work, and we thank you from the bottom of our hearts for 20 wonderful years of CHANGING LIVES. Michael spoke about the impact that CFED's SEED Program (**S**avings for **E**ducation, **E**ntrepreneurship and **D**ownpayment Initiative) has had on his own life. SEED is a multi-year national initiative to develop, test and impel matched savings accounts and financial education for children and youth. More than a third of the 4 million American children born each year—and more than half of minority children—are born into families with negligible savings to weather emergencies or invest in their futures.
